

SUSTAINABILITY POLICY

We also desire to maintain a culture that is considerate, nurturing, inclusive and respectful to the surrounding environment and those who live here. This policy outlines the environmental and sustainable expectations that apply to any member of staff, student, visitor and parent or guardian of an enrolled student who attends the Castlemaine Steiner School (CSSK or the School).

Vision and principles

Castlemaine Steiner School and Kindergarten acknowledges the critical role sustainability plays in maintaining the health of the Earth's ecosystems. As an institution, we are committed to becoming a model of sustainability, not only through conscious resource management but by actively embedding environmental awareness into every aspect of our educational approach. By managing resources efficiently, minimising waste, and embracing eco-friendly practices, we strive to create an environment that sets an example for our community and encourages everyone to adopt sustainable lifestyles. Our goal is to inspire students, staff, and families to think critically about their environmental impact and take meaningful action to preserve the Earth for future generations.

In our commitment to sustainability, we also honour and draw upon the deep cultural knowledge of the First Nations peoples and their profound relationship with the land. The wisdom passed down through generations offers us valuable insights into living in harmony with nature, respecting the land, and understanding the interconnectedness of all life. By acknowledging this knowledge, we aim to foster a more inclusive and respectful relationship with the natural world.

Implementation

Living sustainably is the responsibility of all. Maintaining a safe, clean, sustainable school is the responsibility of CSSK staff, students and parents/carers.

CSSK will implement the following to help promote and live sustainably:

- To educate our students, their parents and the wider community in responsible energy usage, water efficiency, waste management and environmental awareness.
- To ensure curriculum delivery incorporates elements of sustainability at all year levels.
- Support Sites and Grounds Team and the Eco Club to create a sustainable site;
- Engage in sustainable actions that are promoted through the RSS framework;
- Lead in exemplary practices in waste management, water and energy usage;
- Develop and use the school grounds to increase local biodiversity;
- Continue to monitor the school's progress towards meeting resource saving targets
- Continue to develop and maintain the School Environmental Management Plan (SEMP)
- Continue to run and promote 'green events' (refer to Green Events Policy)
- Promote sustainability by reporting achievements to the school and local community at assembly and through social media
- Include 'Sustainability and Environment' as a standing agenda item for the school council/board and report results annually (at least).
- Continue to support local businesses and groups such as Newstead Natives and the NCCMA.
